Ordering the demolition and cleanup of real property located at 43816 Parkers Trailer Park Road, Route 12, Redwood, New York (tax parcel no. 14.00-1-11.2).

WHEREAS, an unfortunate fire occurred at the home of Mr. Carl Lawton, 43816 Parkers Trailer Park Road, Route 12, Redwood, New York (tax parcel no. 14.00-1-11.2) on December 1, 2018, tragically taking Mr. Lawton's life; and

WHEREAS, the home and/or property has not been repaired and/or remediated, resulting in a report by the Town Zoning Officer, Mr. Norris Handschuh, to the effect that the property is now infested by rodents (rats); and

WHEREAS, Mr. Handschuh further reports that there are young children living nearby;

WHEREAS, the decedent's son, Derrick Lawton of Philadelphia New York, has advised that he does not have authority by the Surrogate's Court to deal with the property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a Resolution dated May 26, 2020 the Town Board authorized service upon Mr. Derrick Lawton, via certified mail, notifying him that a hearing would be held before the Town Board in relation to the Town Zoning Officer's report that dangerous or unsafe conditions exist on the property, and that such hearing would be held on Wednesday, June 24, 2020 at 5:15 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Lawton was provided with mailed notice, together with notice posted on the property and later affixed to his home in Philadelphia, New York, with a copy mailed to him by certified mail by the process server; and

WHEREAS, the notice to Derrick Lawton advised that he was entitled to a hearing on whether the Town Board should direct the demolition of the structure and cleanup of the property and to assess all expenses thereof against the land on which it is located to be collected in the manner that real property taxes are collected and/or to institute a special proceeding to collect the costs of demolition; including legal expenses, all as authorized by Town of Alexandria Local Law No. 1 of 1983, "providing for the repair or removal of unsafe buildings and collapsed structures;" and

WHEREAS, Mr. Lawton failed to appear at the scheduled hearing after due notice of the same:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Alexandria, New York that the Town Zoning Officer is hereby directed to obtain the quotes of three persons or entities capable of removing the structure and cleaning the Lawton property and then to retain the services of the responsive/responsible person or entity with the lowest quotation to perform the remediation and that, upon payment by the Town, the amount so paid by the Town shall be levied against the property to be paid and collected as a tax thereon, all in accordance with the Town's Local Law No. 1 of 1983.

## ORDINANCE NO. 12 OF 2020 FOR THE TOWN OF ALEXANDRIA

WHEREAS, the Town of Alexandria's Carnegie Bay Water District was established by ordinance known as "The Town of Alexandria Water Use Ordinance for Carnegie Bay Water District," which ordinance established the boundaries of the District as shown on Schedule A, and containing approximately 11.13 acres; and

WHEREAS, application has been made by Robert Johnson on behalf of an entity known as Carnegie Bay Marina for the extension of the Water District boundaries to permit service to the marina and its environs; and

WHEREAS, the proposed extension is approximately 9.2 acres, a metes and bounds description of which is attached to this Ordinance as Schedule B; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has prepared plans detailing the proposed addition to District boundaries, to include a survey of the proposed District; a site plan reflecting the usage within the district; a site grading and ESC Plan; a Utility Plan containing miscellaneous details concerning typical trenches, typical water main and sewer separation, water service installation and typical pump station detail, etc., all of which are attached as Schedule C and which have been considered by the Town Board in evaluating the request; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Alexandria Bay has agreed to add an additional 3,000 gallons per day to the Carnegie Bay Water District's allocation to allow for potential expansion and additional improvements, which approval is in excess of the Carnegie Bay Marina's proposed average day peak use of 1,880 gallons per day; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Alexandria Bay has separately approved a direct hookup of the Carnegie Bay Marina to the Village's municipal sewer system; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Alexandria desires to expand the boundaries of the Carnegie Bay Water District in accordance with the request and, in addition, to amend the Carnegie Bay Water District Ordinance, generally, to allow for changes in water rates within the District by resolution of the Board after consideration of the finances of the District at the time of the Town Board's consideration of each annual budget of the Town,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Board of the Town of Alexandria, that the boundaries of the Town of Alexandria Water Use Ordinance for Carnegie Bay

Water District shall be amended as follows: Article II of the Ordinance shall be amended to include the following:

**District Boundaries** – The original boundaries of the District, upon its formation, are shown on the attached Schedule A; effective June 24, 2020, the District boundaries shall be extended to include all properties within the description at the attached Schedule B in addition to those described in Schedule A.

Article IX – Application and Procedure for Connection to the Water Distribution System – Shall be amended to include the following connection fees for residential properties and/or commercial properties: For residential properties, the connection fee shall be \$1,000.00. For commercial properties, the connection fee shall be determined by applying the maximum design flow of the project  $\div$  a single EDU design flow of 330 gallons per day, applying a rate of \$1,000.00 per EDU. For example, for a maximum design flow of 1,800 gallons per day, with a design flow for a single EDU of 330 gallons per day, the connection fee for a commercial property would be 1800 gallons per day  $\div$  330 gallons x \$1,000.00, or \$5,454.00.

**Article XI – Water Rate** – The water rate shall be fixed and established by the Town Board at least annually during its annual budget process, or at any other time it is deemed necessary or appropriate by the Town Board.

Establishment of the water rate by the Town Board shall be by resolution. Until a new rate is fixed and established by the Town Board, the existing rates shall continue in effect. Any water rate established other than during the annual budget process, when water rates shall be considered as a part of any public hearing on the annual budget, such water rates shall be established by ordinance requiring a separate public hearing.

THIS AGREEMENT made this <u>24</u> day of <u>June</u> 2020, made by and between the TOWN OF ALEXANDRIA, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, with its principal office at 46372 County Route 1, Alexandria Bay, New York 13607, (hereinafter the "Town"), and the

JEFFERSON ABSTRACT CORPORATION, with offices at 119 Sherman Street, Watertown, New York 13601 (hereinafter, "Abstractor");

# **RECITALS**

- 1. The Town has undertaken a public improvement project known as Route 12 Sewer District #2 whereby the Town will construct Sewer facilities for the residents of said District.
- 2. Prior to installing any facilities, the Town must obtain easements in order to access properties.
- 3. An Abstractor is needed to provide information for the preparation of such easements by way of stub searches.
- 4. The Town finds that it is in the best interest of the District to have Abstractor provide the same.
- 5. It is the purpose of this agreement to set forth the terms of the agreement between the parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, it is hereby agreed as follows:

Abstractor shall provide Town with stub searches for the property list provided by the Town's engineers for the Town of Alexandria Route 12 Sewer District #2 within the Town of Alexandria.

Abstractor shall bill the Town at a rate of \$150.00 per stub search.

Town shall pay Abstractor for this service within forty-five (45) days of receipt of Abstractor's invoice.

Abstractor at all times shall be considered an independent contractor and not an employee or an agent of the Town of Alexandria.

Abstractor agrees to indemnify and hold Town harmless from any and all liability of any nature whatsoever occasioned by the provision of its services.

This agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and may not be changed, modified or altered except in writing duly signed and acknowledged by the parties. This agreement shall be interpreted by and in accordance of the laws of the State of New York.
